

Congratulations on your brand new Daniels Made handpan! Throughout the building process, I strive to achieve stable tuning, strength of volume, warm timbre, and singing sustain in every instrument that goes under my hammer. As a handpan player first, this handcrafted sound sculpture meets my quality standards of performance, and I am honored that you've chosen it to play a part in your musical journey!

Maintenance Care and Instructions:

1. This handpan is made out of stainless steel. The chromium/iron alloy of this metal provides excellent rust and weather protection, however it is not totally impervious to corrosion. It is important that you keep your instrument lubricated regularly (I recommend Phoenix Handpan Oil that can be found at Amazon.com). Do not let your handpan get wet, and dry it immediately if it does. If rust does develop on the surface, gently try to remove it with a microfiber cloth. If the rust has developed deeper in the metal, I recommend using the Miracle All-purpose Polishing Cloth (also found on Amazon). <u>CAUTION</u>: using this cloth or any other abrasive rust remover can permanently remove or mar the patina of the instrument, exposing the bare steel beneath the patina layer. Use *lightly* and *sparingly*! Do <u>not</u> store the handpan zipped in its case for long periods of time (i.e. more than 2 weeks) as this can trap moisture and increase the risk of rust developing. When possible, keep the case unzipped with a moisture eating desiccant pouch inside. A low humidity environment is ideal and will prevent corrosion.

2. Direct sunlight will heat up the surface of the instrument to upwards of 200°. This is the case with all handpans. Rapid surface heating will make the tuning of the instrument go flat. Once the instrument is cooled down to normal air temperature, the tuning will return to normal most of the time. However, it is best not to risk it and keep your handpan in the shade as much as possible.
